Ms. Joy Duke and her daughter Adrianna will have a home to call their own thanks to many dedicated Habitat volunteers and supporters. This home, built by the students of Harford Technical High School, is the first student-built, modular, LEED certified green home in Maryland. We believe it to be the first of its kind in the nation as well. Major funding for this home was provided by Bank of America. Other top donors include the Emmert Hobbs Foundation, the Student Trades Foundation, Patuxent Environmental Group, American Infrastructure, Harford County Government, United Way of Central Maryland and the Maryland Affordable Housing Trust.
